# Feeding the Hungry

Judaism teaches us that we are responsible for those who cannot take care of themselves, no matter what the reason may be. We should be involved and concerned with the plight of fellow human beings. Every life is sacred, and we are obligated to do what we can to help others.

The following story from the Chassidic tradition illustrates the value in sharing and helping others:



A great rabbi was given the privilege of seeing Heaven and Hell before his death. He was taken first to Hell, where he was confronted with a huge room which contained a large elegant table covered from one end to the other with the most delicious foods that the eyes have ever seen or the mouth tasted. All around the table people were sitting looking at the food...and wailing. For al-though each person had this incredible banquet before him, no one was able to eat the food. Everyone's arms were splinted so that the elbows could not bend. These people could touch the food but could not bring it to their mouths to enjoy it.

The great rabbi then was taken to Heaven, and to his surprise, he was confronted by the identical scene: the large banquet room, elegant table, lavish settings, and sumptuous foods. Once again, everyone's arms were splinted so the elbows could not bend. Here, however, there was no wailing, but rather joy greater than he had ever experienced in his life. For while the people here could not put the food into their own mouths, each picked up the food and fed it to another. They were thus able to enjoy, not only the beautiful scene, the wonderful smells, and the delicious foods, but the joy of sharing and helping one another.

Dear Congregants,

What are you hungry for? If you are hungry for a spiritually uplifting experience, Jewish education, and a place to connect with friends and bask in your Jewish identity, Congregation B'nai Israel is your home. At Congregation B'nai Israel we strive to feed your hunger for a more meaningful life. As a Reform congregation we are also concerned with the greater community and those that may be feeling the physical pain of hunger. Next mouth our congregation will participate in the Jewish Federation of Greater Atlanta Annual 2014 Hunger Walk to help those in need.

One of the tenets of Reform Judaism is the concept of Tikkum Olam, repairing the world. As Jews it is imperative that we reach out as a community to help support those that are hungry.

- 20 percent of the people living in Georgia are food insecure, meaning that they don't always know where they will find their next meal. This is up from 19.9% last year. (Feeding America, 2013 Map the Meal Gap Study released in June 2013 reflects data collected in 2011.)
- 28.8 percent of Georgia children live in food insecure households. This is up from 28.3% last year and is well over one in every four Georgia children. The USDA defines food insecurity as the lack of access to adequate food resulting from the lack of money and other resources. (Feeding America, 2013 Map the Meal Gap: Child Food Insecurity study released in June 2013 reflects data collected in 2011)

Monthly allotments for food-insecure families receiving food stamps decreased beginning Nov. 1, 2013. **\$36** less each month for a household of four. (Atlanta Community Food Bank and Center for Budget and Policy Priorities, Oct. 2013)

Our congregation is planning to participate in two activities that will allow us to help those that are in need of food. The first is our Hunger Walk Social on Saturday March 1, 2014 at the home of Dr. Jeffrey and Karen Kalins at 7pm. We are asking that you make a donation to the Hunger Walk that evening as well as bringing an appetizer or dessert to share. This will be a great opportunity to socialize with friends and help out those in need. The second opportunity to feed the hungry is walking as a team member or sponsoring the CBI Striders in the Annual Hunger Walk on March 9 at Turner Field. We will walk as a team, young and old carrying our Congregation banner to show our support for this worthy cause as well as teaching our youngsters by example the importance of tzedakah. See the flyer for more information about this event and how to donate. As a congregation we will be a strong force in supporting the greater community to reach its goals of making a difference in feeding the hungry of our community. See you at the social and get out your walking shoes!



#### Martin Luther King Day Shabbat



Our Reading Selection is:

Twelve Years A Slave by Solomon Northup

Solomon Northup was born a free man in New York State. At the age of 33 he was kidnapped in Washington D.C. and placed in an underground slave pen. Northup was transported by ship to New Orleans where he was sold into slavery. He spent the next 12 years working as a carpenter, driver, and cotton picker. This narrative reveals how Northup survived the harsh conditions of slavery, including smallpox, lashings, and an attempted hanging. Solomon Northup was among a select few who were freed from slavery. His account describes the daily life of slaves in Louisiana, their diet and living conditions, the relationship between master and slave, and how slave catchers used to recapture runaways. Northup's first person account, published in 1853, was a dramatic story in the national debate over slavery that took place in the nine years leading up to the start of the American Civil War.

Here's what you need to do:

- 1) Get a copy of the book (buy or borrow)
- 2) Read the book
- 3) Come to Book Club on February 26th and be prepared to participate in a lively discussion and dissection of the book
