I took the opportunity extended to me and decided to teach. I met new friends and felt more connected to our Jewish community.

We got a sitter, we had a good meal, a few drinks and caught up with CBI friends. Purim is March 16, another chance to catch up with friends, eat good food and see a play. Shalom, everyone -

We sometimes have moments in life where we feel we have lost everything. No matter what something looks like to an outsider, we each have our own reality when it comes to how we perceive our world and the effect it has upon us. It is no surprise that one person may be greatly affected by something that happens while another may seem completely untouched by the same event. Human beings may have been created as equal, but no one ever said they were created identically. Yet we still ask the question – WHY? Why did this happen to me? Why doesn't anyone understand how I feel? Why can't I get over these feelings? There are no easy answers to those questions. Perhaps, instead, we might ask a different question, one that actually can give us power and comfort. Here it is: What can we do when we feel we have lost everything?

One of the most helpful ways to pull ourselves out of a small funk or a huge chasm is to look at what we still have and what we can still do. When we feel we have lost everything, we still have:

Preposterous, you say! I can hear you, because I hear myself say that, too. No book can possibly ease my pain. Are you sure? Maybe something humorous with just enough bite to engage you long enough to laugh a little. You might say "I can't take time off to travel." Well, maybe not if you are thinking you must go around the world or across the country. But sometimes, just traveling from your home to a convenient hotel might be enough to refresh your attitude. And if nothing else, just wait. Wait until spring really begins to change our world. All you have to do is tell yourself to wait. Don't do anything rash. Just wait. New life and brilliant change is coming.

It really is amazing how the human mind works. Nothing can alter what has happened to us, but it is how we utilize the moments we still have that is the important thing.

I recently sat down in a dejected heap because I had been unable to schedule a discussion about an issue that has been concerning me greatly. My head echoed with the thought that I was doomed to fail and that I could not manage anything. My heart hurt — a lot! So I tried some things on this list. I sat back for just a moment and waited. I read something funny and laughed. I looked around and saw so many of you giving me what I couldn't give myself — confidence, acceptance, and love. And now, ready or not, I am tackling my important meeting with more courage and power. Things may not work out the way I hope, and perhaps I will not alter anything at all. However, I have been changed from the inside out, and that is the most important thing.

While it is certainly difficult not to dwell on the "why" questions, may we all find ways to embrace what we still have in front of us. Doing so has helped me in stressful times. I hope it may help you, too.



The Obligation of Tzedakah

Giving is an obligation in Judaism, a duty that cannot be forsaken even by those who are themselves in need. Some sages have said that tzedakah is the highest of all commandments, equal to all of them combined, and that a person who does not perform tzedakah is equivalent to an idol worshipper.

This illustrates the importance of tzedakah in Jewish thought. Tzedakah is one of the three acts that gain us forgiveness from our sins. The High Holiday liturgy repeatedly states that G-d has inscribed a judgment against all who have sinned, but teshuvah (repentance), tefillah (prayer) and tzedakah can alleviate the decree.


